CAPTAIN SHEPARD HOUSE POLICIES

The historic Captain Shepard House was built in 1890 by maritime ship captain, Albion E. Shepard. Shepard founded and named the town of Marathon in 1882 after recalling the striking resemblance of the surrounding beautiful mountainous landscape to his travels in Marathon, Greece. Fully restored by the Gage Hotel in 2012, the classic colonial-style home includes five bedrooms in the main building and two in the rear carriage house.

We hope you enjoy your stay here and ask that you honor the reverence of this historic landmark house by following the rules of the house. Common areas which include the TV room, sitting room, dining room, Butlers Kitchen, second floor porch and house grounds are intended for the guests of Captain Shepard House 1-7 only.

- Events and/or parties are not permitted without consent of the Gage Hotel
- All food and alcohol for events/parties must be provided by the Gage Hotel Do not remove any art, decorative items or furnishings from the house or grounds
- Maximum of 2 adults per room is allowed with the exception of room C4 which allows 2 additional guest at an additional charge.
- Pets are not allowed in the Captain Shepard House
